



Publication Ethics

Authors, reviewers and editors pledge to maintain strict rules of conduct and abide by accepted academic standards of professional ethics. In particular:

A) Authors

- only submit articles written in harmony with applicable legal and ethical regulations and guidelines;
- cite their sources in a standard manner and do not commit plagiarism;
- present a comprehensive picture of their findings, and refrain from presenting data selected in a tendentious or manipulative manner;
- submit original, unpublished texts;
- have significantly contributed to reaching the results reported in their articles;
- keep the submission guidelines;
- aim to incorporate the feedback of reviewers and editors.

B) Editors

- approach contributions in an objective, unbiased and non-discriminatory manner;
- assess the thematic relevance of proposals first, based on the abstracts received prior to the submission of article;
- choose two reviewers from institutions other than that/those of the contributor(s), and bear responsibility for the relevance of the reviewers' expertise;
- base their assessment of contributions on the reviewers' reports.

C) Reviewers

- accept only such contributions for assessment where they can avoid a conflict of interests;
- review contributions in an unbiased manner, to the best of their abilities, with a clear conscience;
- keep the guidelines for reviewers, and submit their assessments using the publication's standard forms.



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
